	<p>AICS is one of the largest international donors of the Sudanese health sector with 24 ongoing initiatives: in 2017, 62% of AICS funding has been dedicated to healthcare activities shaped to concur to SDG #3.</p> <p>In 2017, Italy has been appointed Donor Convener of the UN Movement “Scaling up Nutrition”.</p> <p>Italy’s contribution in supporting the Sudanese health sector are also acknowledged by its role in the Health Partnership Forum, National Health Policy 2017-2030, JAR – Joint Assessment Report and the National Health Insurance Fund reform committee.</p> <p>Initiatives in the years 2016-2019 amount to around 43 MEuro: 8.3 MEuro through the multilateral channel and 34.8 MEuro on the bilateral channel.</p>
8.310 MEuro	Interventions on the multilateral channel include funding to WHO, UNOPS, UNFPA, WFP, WHO, UNDP and UNICEF and comprise support to the PHC system, fight against acute and severe malnutrition, strengthening food security and resilience of communities, overall rehabilitation of the Kassala Health Citadel.

	<p>AICS interventions are aimed at contributing to the promotion of gender equality and the social inclusion and protection of children and persons with disabilities to have equal access to goods and services by increasing resilience through activities of poverty reduction, shared prosperity and human rights in line with SDGs 4, 5, 8 and 10 for an equitable education, participation, and economic growth.</p> <p>The interventions strengthen the institutional capacities for the development of national policies and action plans and targeted interventions aimed at increasing resilience through inclusive educational and poverty reduction models. There are 7 ongoing bilateral, and multilateral initiatives with UNICEF, UNESCO and UNWOMEN and with Italian NGO</p>
1.3 MEuro	In the multilateral sector , AICS is funding UNESCO with the aim of promoting human development and civic virtues among the Sudanese rural communities through the support of rural radio and UNICEF with the aim of assuring an integrated child protection response for Children on the Move in Khartoum and Eastern States

	<p>AICS interventions are aimed at contributing to the improvement, in a permanent and sustainable way, of access to water, food security, increase in per capita income, relying above all on vulnerable groups. The use of credit microfinance and the creation of revolving funds have allowed the development of sustainable agricultural techniques, aimed at reducing pathogens and improving the variety and to ensure preservability and horticultural qualities to strengthen the business management.</p> <p>5 multilateral projects are ongoing with the FAO, IFAD, UNWOMEN, UNDP and UNIDO and 1 bilateral tackling poverty alleviation</p>
5.120 MEuro	On a multilateral channel , AICS is supporting the UN Agency (FAO, IFAD, UNWOMEN, UNDP and UNIDO) for livelihoods and food & nutrition security, by creating sustainable job opportunities and fostering inclusive economic growth.
3 MEuro	On a bilateral channel , AICS is contributing to long-lasting and sustainable development of targeted population by strengthening agricultural production, improving access to water, as well as facilitating access to school services (especially for girls). Overall, AICS intervention aims at increasing food security, livelihoods and income generating activities among rural families by taking action in the agriculture, water and education sectors.
