



FAQ number 3_ Strengthening a Decentralized Health System for protracted displaced population in Nyala – South Darfur State, reference number: Grant/02/HealthPro/T05-EUTF-HOA-SD-73-01

Q4. For both Priority 1 and Priority 2, are assessments an eligible cost to be covered by the grant?

As mentioned under the Guidelines on page 16 and according to the article 14 of the General Conditions of the contract, the eligible costs are actual costs incurred by the contractor during the implementation period (after signing the contract). No costs incurred during the period out of the contract will be covered by the contracting authority.

Q5. In Priority 1, are existing Bill of Quantities allowed, or will new ones be required?

No Bill of Quantities has been developed about the intervention on the health facilities of the Priority number 1.

Q6. In both Priority 1 and Priority 2, are other sectors encouraged to be a part of implementation?

All sectors related directly or indirectly to the health are most than welcomed, if they could bring added value and don't reduce significantly the budget allocated to the health sector itself.

Q7. Is NCA allowed to apply for both Priority One and Priority Two, or must the NGO decide on only one focus?

Under page 14 of the Guidelines, it is written as follows:

Number of applications and grants per applicants / affiliated entities

The lead applicant may not submit more than 1 application(s) under this call for proposals.

The lead applicant may not be awarded more than 1 grant(s) under this call for proposals.

Q8. The Title on the Guidelines refers to “Nyala-South Darfur State” only, but the title for the same Call on the website states, “Al Fasher and Nyala-North and South Darfur States-NYALA.” Is NCA allowed to respond to the state in either location? Or is it mandatory for both locations?

The applicants must refer to the title of the Guidelines of the call of proposals: “Strengthening a Decentralized Health System for protracted displaced population in Nyala – South Darfur State”. It's high recommended for the applicants to apply for call of proposals in those States where they have already good experiences and knowledge of the region. However, any applicant could be free to apply in one or both States, even if they are not familiar of.

Q9. Is a consortium required? If so, must the partner be Italian?

No consortium is mandatory and any applicants could propose any consortium with any organizations.

Q10. Is IADC expecting the proposal to be written in Italian or English?

All documents must be submitted in English.
