






### Foreword

"SUDANESE HEROINE" is a Comics Strip contest organised by the Italian Agency for Development Cooperation (AICS) - Khartoum Regional Office. The contest aimed to actively engage the Sudanese community in celebrating International Women's Day 2024 with the theme "Sudanese Heroine". The contest invites participants to capture the essence of March 8th in the lives of Sudanese women today. The submitted works creatively and meaningfully addressed various challenges faced by Sudanese women and girls, including the impact of the ongoing conflict. This initiative was carried out under the "WE-RISE!" program - Women's Empowerment for Resilience, Inclusion, Sustainability, and Environment. #### WINNING COMIC 1st Position


### "SHADIA"




The war in Khartoum started to affect our neighborhood months after April 2023.


